


President's Message

The following is a list of virtual tours which allow us the opportunity to "visit" without leaving the comfort, convenience and safety of home. The following list from Good Housekeeping offers virtual tours of zoos and aquariums from all around the globe:

- **The Cincinnati Zoo:** Check in around 3 p.m., because that's the time the Zoo holds a daily Home Safari on its <u>Facebook Live Feed.</u>
- Atlanta Zoo: The Georgia zoo keeps a "Panda Cam" livestream on its website.
- **Georgia Aquarium:** Sea-dwellers like African penguins and Beluga Whales are the stars of this aquarium's <u>live cam</u>.
- Houston Zoo: There are plenty of different animals you can check in on with this <u>zoo's live cam</u>, but we highly recommend watching the playful elephants.
- **The Shedd Aquarium:** This Chicago aquarium shares some pretty adorable behind-the-scenes footage of their residents on <u>Facebook</u>.
- San Diego Zoo: With what may be the most <u>live cam options</u>, this zoo lets you switch between koalas, polar bears, and tigers in one sitting.
- Monterey Bay Aquarium: It can be Shark Week every week thanks to live online footage of Monterey Bay's Habitat exhibit.
- **National Aquarium:** Walk through tropical waters to the icy tundra in this <u>floor-by-floor tour</u> of the famous, Baltimore-based aquarium.
