Mah Jongg



Mah Jongg is an ancient game for women and men, originating in China and brought to America after the war. It is a game using tiles (similar in size to dominoes) and racks usually played by 4 people. Variations or "house rules" are common throughout the country, but for the last 85 years, the National Mah Jongg League has published the official "Hands and Rules Scorecard" for use in the United States. These cards are purchased each year listing a new set of "Hands", or patterns of tiles that must be achieved in order to win a game.



The tiles consist of 3 "suits" (cracks, dots, and bams), "dragons" (red, white and green) "winds" (North, South, East and West), flowers and jokers. These combine in different "hands" or patterns to achieve a winning hand consisting of 14 tiles, by drawing, exchanging, and stealing.

Recently the National League has developed games that can be played by 2 or 3 players at a time, and Mah Jongg is now available to play on the internet.

On Mondays, from 1:00 to 4:00 TRWC members play at the Community Center. We are happy to welcome new members who would like to brush up or learn to play this exciting game. For more information please see the activity information below.
