President's Message

Greetings Turtle Rock:

I hope everyone enjoyed a safe and Happy New Year!

As we move into 2022, we are approaching our Annual Member Meeting, which will be held on February 1, 2022 in the Community Center. This meeting is YOUR meeting, where you can be heard. I encourage everyone to attend either in person or on Zoom. At the subsequent Organizational Meeting, the new Board will elect its officers and appoint committees. As always, there will be both opportunities and challenges for the new Board. With the support of the Turtle Rock community, the new Board will continue the work necessary to ensure that Turtle Rock remains one of the most fiscally sound and desirable communities on Palmer Ranch.

The Natural Assets Committee reports that the pond shoreline restoration work is

complete on Pond 13 (Sabal Lake large pond), including the installation of aquatic plants.

Ponds 9 (SE corner of Nice Way and Turtle Rock Blvd) and 12 (small Sabal Lake pond on the east side of Turtle Rock Blvd) are scheduled next for shoreline restoration, with work on Pond 9 scheduled to start by the end of January 2022.

The FIRM (Finance, Investments, & Risk Management) is working on a new contract with Sunstate Management to continue as our property management company, focusing on revised compliance policy and enforcement procedures. These are being implemented in 2022 with the objective of reducing the number of viola-

tions, while improving the overall appearance of Turtle Rock.

The Communications Committee will implement *The Help Desk* starting the 2nd week in January, teaching volunteers who will sit at the clubhouse to assist our property manager with many of the day-to-day activities, such as answering questions and providing forms.

The TROM (Turtle Rock Owner's Manual) update task force has sent a draft of the revised TROM to the Board to review and provide any suggested edits, after which the draft will be sent to our attorney for review. We hope to have the revised TROM finished in time to present it to the Board at the January meeting for adoption.

December Board Actions

- approve the revised Turtle Rock compliance policy that will be incorporated into the revised TROM.
- approve the start date for the gate attendant pay increase retroactively to November 1, 2021 (originally January 1, 2022). This exceeds the 2021 budget by approx. \$4000, but it is needed to help Allied hire and retain attendants.
- approve purchase and installation of a new lighted fountain for Pond 1 (the pond at the south gate). If the new fountain is in stock, it should be installed by the end of January.

January 4, 2022 at 6:30 pm is the next Board of Governors meeting.

The meeting will be held in the clubhouse with limited seating available, and also be available on ZOOM. Log-in link and call-in phone number will be provided along with the agenda by email. Please plan to attend.

TR Board Nominations Committee

The 2022 Board of Governors: The Nominations Committee for the upcoming Board of Governors was named by the Board at the November meeting. Grace Sammon and Ivan Gould are Co-Chairs, Angela Hilton Calvo the Board Liaison.

Board President David Bryan and Board Member John Burke will be leaving their seats at the end of their term. We sincerely thank David Bryan for his leadership, and John Burke for his dedicated service.

Eblasts went out to all owners regarding the two vacancies, and signs were posted at the gates for the self-nominating process.

Nominations closed at 4pm on Thursday, 23 December. All applications were date stamped, and Grace Sammon was at the Community Center to ensure that adherence was made to the timeline.

The applications of the two candidates will be reviewed as to compliance with HOA practices and fees. Since the number of applicants does not exceed the number of Board vacancies, no "Meet the Candidates" event will be held, and no election is necessary. The candidates will be appointed to the Board at the HOA's Annual Member Meeting held on 1 February at 6:00 pm.

Immediately following the Member Meeting, the 2022 Board is seated and conducts an Organizational Meeting during which officers are chosen and committees are re-established.

The Nominations Committee thanks Ms. Boehm and Ms. Harris for their commitment to Turtle Rock and their interest in serving our community.

Turtle Rock has a variety of benefits for their residents to enjoy. Two tennis courts, basketball court, heated swimming pool, outside workout area, nature trail and Community Center (CC). The CC has been used by

many of the residents for parties, club meetings and a variety of other celebrations.

Let's cover the CC "dos" and don'ts" —

The CC offers a main room, mini kitchen (microwave, refrigerator, sink only), library, restrooms, and a large partially covered outside patio area. The patio has tables and chairs overlooking one of thirty-one ponds throughout the Turtle Rock community. The main room has a capacity of 55 people. Res-

ervations are simple to make (request forms available on the website or in the office), and rent is a reasonable hourly rate of \$15. Whether you are having a barbeque, or an event catered to the CC, it is a true asset to the community!

There are a few rules that we ask residents

to follow. While using the CC, let your group know that the reservation is for that building, so please don't let your guests take drinks, food or other items to the tennis courts, basketball court, or swimming pool area. If your guests do

visit the pool or other areas, you must accompany them.

When you are done with the CC, we ask that all trash is bagged up and removed. Please vacuum the inner area and sweep the outer area after each use. Place all tables and chairs as you found them. Lock both the rear and front door, and drop the key in the black box right outside the CC door.

Thanks for the team effort in taking care of these amenities.



As the volunteers get up to speed, and needs are assessed, we hope to expand those hours.



We are exploring trail bridge improvements, navigational signage and mapping, screening where needed to enhance privacy, and potentially a kayak ramp near the main bridge. In recognition of our residents' many initiatives to maintain and improve their properties, we are announcing a CONTEST. We invite everyone to submit a guess as to how


many ARC requests were received in 2021. The winner who comes closest without going over will receive a
