SARASOTA AUDUBON SOCIETY – BIRD WATCHING TOURS

The Sarasota Audubon Society is hosting bird watching field trips from **8:30am to 10:00am every Thursday through April 12th**. This walk begins at the Nature Center of Oscar Scherer State Park. Park opens 8:00am and park entrance fee applies. No reservations necessary. No pets please, wear comfortable walking shoes, sunscreen, insect repellent; drinking water, camera and binoculars recommended. Guided bird walk on sandy hiking trails through the various park habitats, guided by alternating leaders Joyce Leary and Peter Brown.

GUIDED SCRUB JAY WALK

This walk begins at the Nature Center **every Sunday from 8:30am to 10:00am** and includes an informative walk through an ancient dune system. This unique habitat is home to the threatened Florida scrub-jay and a variety of plants and other animals. Participants should wear comfortable footwear for walking in soft sand. Cameras and binoculars are suggested. Space is limited to 15 people. There is no cost to participate other than normal park entrance fees for day-use.

EAGLE VIEWING

Join the weekly eagle watch **every Sunday from 9:00am to 11:00am** and see how their pair of nesting Bald Eagles are doing. High-powered scope and trail maps are provided. Comfortable shoes, camera and binoculars are suggested. Located at the eagle viewing station along the Green Trail. Note: There is a 20-minute, self-guided walk to the eagle viewing station. Free with camping or standard park entrance fee.
